- Accreditation is not intended to be "add on" work rather an opportunity to reflect on how day to day work can be improved to align with accreditation standards.
 Organizations are assessed against standards to identify strengths and areas that require improvement.
- Accreditation Standards:
 - Define/"set the bar" for organization practice
 - Reflect best practices and emerging trends
 - Major tests of compliance (immediate impact on safety)
 - Minor tests of compliance (support longer terms safety culture and quality Improvement activities)
 - Designed to be easily integrated into daily activities
 - An ongoing tool for quality improvement
